A note to parents on purchasing instruments:

Buying a band instrument is similar to buying a car. You have your choice of something high end and luxurious, something smart and dependable, or you can get the old clunker. We want you to get the best value for your money, and usually with instruments, you get what you pay for. We do not want you to get the most expensive instrument you can find. We strongly advise you to stay away from the most inexpensive instruments, which are typically found in places like the internet or stores that sell other things besides music instruments (like department stores). In our experience, while these instruments appear to be affordable, the build quality is inconsistent and repairs are not always possible. Please only purchase instruments from a reputable music store. If you find what you think is a good, used instrument in a place such as a pawn shop, Facebook marketplace, Craigslist, etc, please send a link to the band director first so that they can see if you are getting your money's worth. Please try to stick to the brands given to you on this list.

Una nota para los padres sobre los instrumentos de compra:

Comprar un instrumento de banda es similar a comprar un automóvil. Puede elegir entre algo lujoso y de alta gama, algo inteligente y confiable, o puede obtener el viejo cacharro. Queremos que obtenga el mejor valor por su dinero y, por lo general, con los instrumentos, obtiene lo que paga. No queremos que obtenga el instrumento más caro que pueda encontrar. Le recomendamos encarecidamente que se mantenga alejado de los instrumentos más económicos, que normalmente se encuentran en lugares como Internet o tiendas que venden otras cosas además de instrumentos musicales (como los grandes almacenes). En nuestra experiencia, si bien estos instrumentos parecen ser asequibles, la calidad de construcción es inconsistente y no siempre es posible realizar reparaciones. Adquiera instrumentos únicamente en una tienda de música acreditada. Si encuentra lo que cree que es un buen instrumento usado en un lugar como una casa de empeño, mercado de Facebook, Craigslist, etc., envíe primero un enlace al director de la banda para que pueda ver si está obteniendo el valor de su dinero. Intente ceñirse a las marcas que se le proporcionaron en esta lista.
